My Great-Great Grandfather, Kenneth MacLennan was employed by Murdo MacKenzie of Loch Carron. A property of 10 acres, Gortenfrich, (Gorstan). Kenneth was born 1 April, 1826 in Strathbran, Scot. He married Mary MacKenzie, daughter of Murdo MacKenzie. Mary was born 10 March, 1832 in Loch Carron, and Kenneth and Mary were married 24 April, 1852 at Loch Carron Free Church of Scotland. They migrated to Australia on "The Araminta" leaving Liverpool on 20 June, 1852.

THE MacLENNAN FAMILY LINE:

G.G.G.Grandfather Farquhar MacLennan was born 1779 in Strath Conan, Scotland and died in Urquhart Logie Wester, Scotland 16 April, 1871. G.G.G.Grandmother Ann nee Cameron was born 1796 in Kinlochewe, Scot. and died in Urquhart Logie Wester, Scot. 14 March, 1873 (Ref. No. 1873-25 or 21). At the time of death, Ann was living at Breaklach of Kinson, Urquhart, Scot. Children as follows: William b.16 Jan. 1819 Knockbain of Strathbain, Contin. Duncan b.25 Feb. 1821 Knockbain of Strathbain, (Duncan m Elizabeth McDonald and went to Ireland.); Kenneth b.1 April 1826-27 Strathbran; Ann b.3 June, 1827-28 Strathbran; John b.15 Dec. 1829 Dalriach; Murdock b.14 May, 1832 Dalriach; Grace b. 14 April, 1834 Dalriach. (E.C.R. Contin, Scot.)

Kenneth and Mary arrived in Australia on 4 October, 1852 Disembarking at Point Henry near Geelong, Vic. Possible that Ann (above list) made the voyage also.

THE EARLY CLAN DAYS

Early Days in the Central Ontario Branch of Clan MacLennan

In this newsletter we are reprinting a letter from Doug MacLennan in British Columbia. He was asked last year at Fergus for some of his memories of the early years for Clan MacLennan in Canada. Given our recent news of Mary's passing, the clan's first newsletter (attachment) and photo of Smoky and Mary MacLennan (page 3) are especially appropriate and remind us of a wonderful and dedicated couple.

Dear Melanie:

Thanks for a great Newsletter. I was going thru some old files looking for some blank paper, that I seem to keep running out of, and found some of these sheets. I am sending this snail mail because of the enclosures. I am not nimble enough to send them by email!

Reminiscence:

How it all got started? Brother Dave has mentioned the family History written in the '30's by a great Aunt. I became very interested in this History, thinking it should be updated, since we, [Don, Dave, Myself, Mary and John] had been penciled in by my mother. So-one thing led to another, I got possession of the History, updating over the years, became a byword. About the same time, Dave enrolled us in the Clan Assoc. Scotland, I had a letter from Chief Ronald at the time, about some cousins in Virginia, Holland and B.C. Canada. I was hooked, I guess not only on our History but The Clan Assoc. I had to meet the Chief and the Cousins he told me about. This meant a trip to Nova Scotia, and Virginia as well as Scotland. The family History, with the help of nephew Richard was updated in '03.

Elva and I went to Scotland, we had met the Chief and Cousin Woody Woodward from Virginia the year before in Iona N.S. We met the other cousins Dr. High from B.C. and Lodiqiqk from Holland. Quite and experience. This was in '84. While in Scotland I suggested the Chief that he ask Elva [on the sly] and I to start a branch in Ontario.

Thru access to phone books in S. Ont. West, as far as Peterborough, we sent invitations to come to Fergus for a meeting of Mc's and Mac's on June 2nd 1985. I'm sure we sent out over 300 invitations? 100 or so came and C.O.B. was tentatively started.

Was it '84 or 85? We lived close to the park in Fergus where the Fergus Games were held. I knew that clan Canopies were up each year, I THINK, we rented a canopy on speculation in '84? With '85 being the year we officially started, after the invitations were sent out. Eileen in Ottawa had a group that had been meeting regularly, I was not aware of, somehow we made contact with her and more or less joined forces, and she has been a strong supporter ever since, even bringing in Robin (her brother).

I have enclosed News Letter No. One, I think I still have copies of most of the other ones, until we moved West in Nov. '88. This NewsLetter tells about Smoky and his wife Mary coming from N.S. Smoky was the Chief's Lt. and active in Clan affairs. The

enclosed photo shows Smoky and Mary with a Scotch thistle that had grown up beside our house in Fergus. I transplanted it into a pot and it was carried down the hill to the canopy.

The Clan Assoc. in Scotland was quite strong at the time, with support from Australia, U.S. and Canada. I should mention here that a group were meeting regularly in N.S./Cape Breton and helped us bring the Chief to Fergus in '87. A museum was underway on the shores of Loch Duich, in our Homeland of Kintail.

At the present time, Australia and Canada appear to be the only functioning branches. I am sure Chief Ruairidh is working very hard to revive Scotland, he certainly is a good ambassador, with his travels and piping.

I am also enclosing an advertisement that has been running in our local papers, as well as a copy to Robin. He should appreciate the connotations. Perhaps you have seen it in your paper? We have a nephew that works for Bell Mobility who placed the ad. Thanks again for a great News Letter. Your smile on the front gives it an inviting welcome. Hope plans to bring the Chief back materialize.
